Churchill student teacher ratios decreased between 2012 and 2019. This is the case when all K-6 classes are averaged together, as well as for each individual class. 5th grade student teacher ratios decreased the most, go-ing from 28 students per teacher to 14 students per teacher. 1st through 4th grade teacher to student ratios increased from 2012-2019.
