Census Bureau Definition

The Census Bureau uses a set of monetary income thresholds that vary by family size and composition to determine who is in poverty. If the total income for a family or unrelated individual falls below the relevant poverty threshold, then the members of the household are considered to be in poverty.

Churchill **student teacher ratios** decreased between 2012 and 2019. This is the case when all K-6 classes are averaged together, as well as for each individual class. 5th grade student teacher ratios decreased the most, going from 28 students per teacher to 14 students per teacher. 1st through 4th grade teacher to student ratios increased from 2012-2019.
