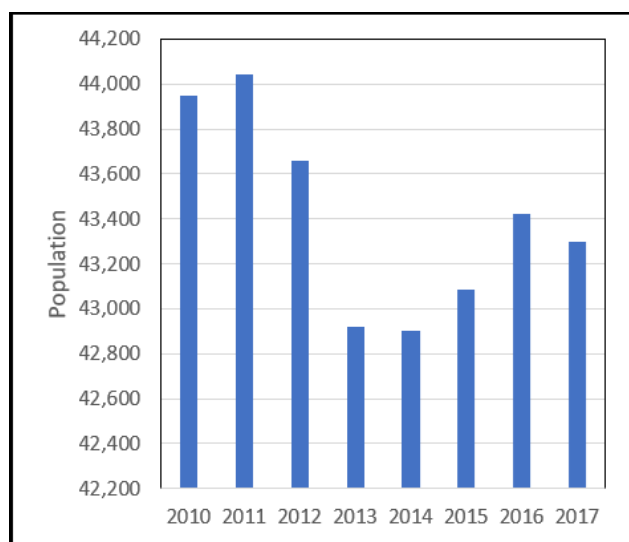

POPULATION



Between 2010 and 2017, Nye's population decreased while Esmeralda's has increased. Total population in Nye has decreased by more than 700 since 2011, and this is mainly from northern Nye, which went from 5,479 to 4,672 in the span of six years.



VETERANS

Between 2010 and 2017, Nye County veterans decreased by 1,160. This was a 16.4% decrease, compared to Nevada's 10.1% decrease. In 2010, 94.0% of the veterans were males. In 2017, 90.7% of the veterans were males.

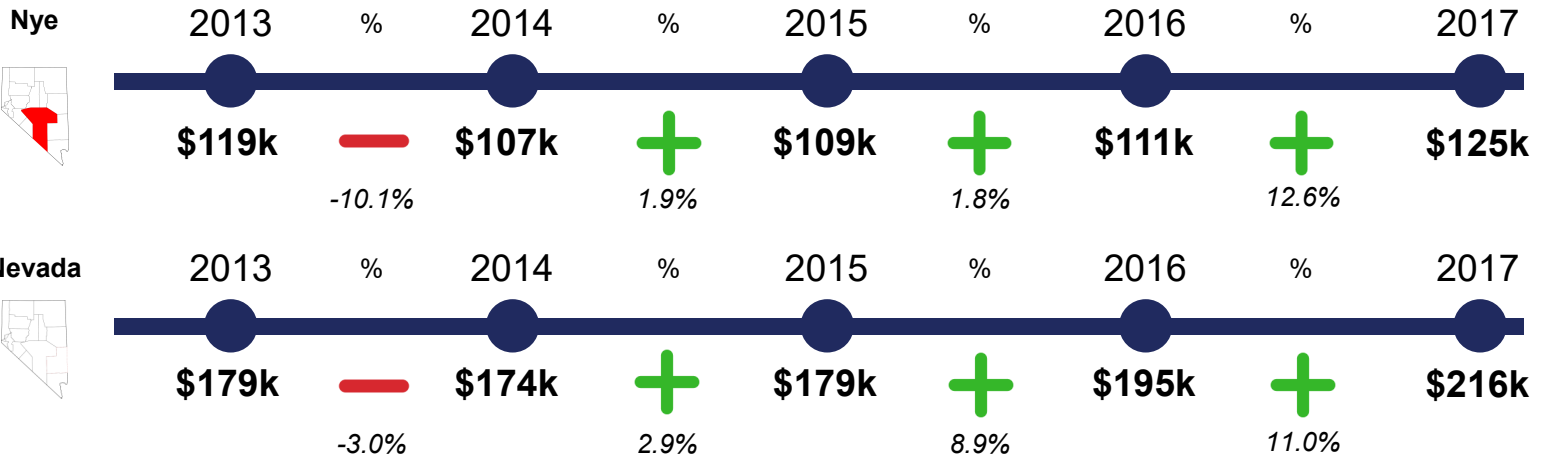

All amounts are shown in 2017 dollars



Over the time period, homes in Nye worth less than \$99,999 have increased. Homes above this price point have gone down in percentage, with the exception of homes between \$100,000 and \$149,999, which have slightly increased.
