ANNUAL ACHIEVEMENT RECORD - Purpose & Tips

Purpose

4-H end of year documentation serves a variety of purposes in the 4-H youth development program. Record keeping, a valuable life skill, allows Members to document completed work as well as identify Project and Club activities, achievements and knowledge gained. Through consistent and conscientious completion of these documents, Members chart their personal growth and measure achievement throughout their 4-H careers.

Record keeping teaches/develops these additional life skills and valuable habits:

- Maintaining consistent records of attendance, achievement and experiences
- Improved communication
- Self reflection/evaluation
- · Learning time management and organizational skills
- Learning responsibility and goal setting skills
- Using records to build a history of participation and achievement for scholarship applications, job applications and to identify areas of personal growth

The Nevada 4-H Program Annual Achievement Record is meant to accompany and serve as the basis for completion of the Nevada 4-H Star Rank Program <u>Application</u>. Individual 4-H County Programs may require additional materials from 4-H Members for completion of a 4-H Year. (Exs. "Portfolios," "Record Books," etc.). Members should contact their local 4-H Office to learn what is required to complete a 4-H Year and receive full recognition for that year's activities.

Include your specific involvement (attended, competed, presented, etc.) and level of participation through these code letters: $\mathbf{I} = \text{Individual}$, $\mathbf{L} = \text{Local Club/Unit/Project}$, $\mathbf{C} = \text{County}$, $\mathbf{M} = \text{Multi-County/Section}$, $\mathbf{A} = \text{Area}$, $\mathbf{S} = \text{State}$, $\mathbf{N} = \text{National/Multi-State}$, $\mathbf{G} = \text{Global}$.

Use these contest, show or event placing abbreviations: $\mathbf{W} = \text{White}$, $\mathbf{R} = \text{Red}$, $\mathbf{B} = \text{Blue}$, $\mathbf{RC} = \text{Reserve Champion}$, $\mathbf{C} = \text{Champion}$ and $\mathbf{GC} = \text{Grand Champion}$.

If you do not have information or did not participate in an activity, put "N/A" or "Not Applicable" in the specified section. This indicates you did not have a response, as opposed to forgetting to complete it.

<u>The Annual Achievement Record,</u> Nevada 4-H Star Rank Program should be completed in ink, typed or computer generated.

Items cannot be counted in multiple categories (e.g. double-counting). However, if a Member participates in multiple activities during one event, those separate activities may be counted and attendance at the event counted. (Ex. Member participates in the Nevada Junior Livestock Show AND is a Member of the NJLS Youth Advisory Council.)

Youth/Adult Partnership OR Mentoring

This includes partnerships with adults and/or the mentoring of new 4-H Members. Youth/Adult Partnerships (YAPs) encompass a more robust or involved relationship then would exist if the youth and adult were strictly committee members. Partnership implies two individuals working toward a singular goal, with both parts having an equal voice and responsibility for outcomes.

Mentoring implies more of a teacher/student relationship then would be in a YAP or in a Project/Club (Leader/Member) setting. The adult (or older youth) serves as a counselor or teacher to the younger 4-H Member. To be recognized by 4-H, the mentoring relationship should be arranged by 4-H staff and involve a committed agreement between the Leader (or older youth) and mentee. Mentoring consists of working with and teaching the newer Member. Youth/Adult Partnerships and Mentoring are counted by number of instances.

This <u>Application</u> is for 4-H Members applying for the honor of All Star Rank in Nevada's 4-H Star Rank Program. All Star Rank is the highest award in the Program; recipients are unquestionably the best examples of youth who've excelled in 4-H. Recipients have a variety of exposure to 4-H Projects, Club, events and conferences, have mastered many life skills and show the highest levels of achievement and commitment in all responsibilities.

Requirements for All Star Rank application:

- 1) Must have received Gold Star Rank in the NV 4-H Star Rank Program (or equivalent States' Program.)
- 2) Must be 17 years of age (4-H Age.)
- 3) Must have endorsement of County UNCE/4-H staff (as evidenced by signature on Application.)
- 4) Must have support of Parent/Guardian (as evidenced by signature on Application.)
- 5) Must have been an exhibitor or participant in a State level Contest, conference or event; participation in a Regional or National level Contest, conference or event is an alternative.
- 6) Must submit Application to the appropriate UNCE County Office by stated deadline accompanied by:
 - a) Letter of endorsement from 1 (one) 4-H Leader with direct knowledge of Member suitability for honor.
 - b) Letter of endorsement from 1 (one) County UNCE/4-H staff person with direct knowledge of Member suitability for honor.
 - c) Current Annual Achievement Record.
 - d) Current photo (ex. school photo or photo from shoulders.)
 - e) Completed <u>4-H Photo/Audio/Video/Quote/Name/Town Release</u>
