

^{*}Over 55% of single-day visitors spent 3 to 4 hours at the park.

"Visitor-Days" is the weighted duration of the visitor number by the amount of time visitors were at the park. Someone visiting for a couple hours is weighted less than someone who spent the entire day at the park, who is, in turn, weighted less than someone who camped at the park for multiple nights.







[&]quot;Visitors" is defined as the total number of people who visited the park in a given year. This may include repeat visits throughout the year, but does not include multiple entries for a single park visit.








Household Income












