
We are also the only organization with a scientifically proven approach to developing young people, backed by more than 20 years of longitudinal research in partnership with Tufts University. The data are clear: youth who participate in 4-H programs are more likely to succeed academically, engage civically, and contribute to their communities. They're also more prepared to enter the workforce and navigate the complexities of life with confidence.

At the heart of our success is the 4-H Thriving Model which outlines key milestones and capabilities that youth should develop at different stages of their lives. From middle childhood, where teamwork and belonging are emphasized, to middle adolescence, where independence and future planning take center stage, the Thriving Model ensures that youth not only develop academic skills but also gain character traits—such as responsibility, social competence, and resilience—needed for lifelong success.

Beyond Ready Framework

The 4-H Beyond Ready Framework shows how positive youth development and programs that help youth be ready for life after high school work

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together to ensure that 4-H graduates are ready, in fact, because of positive youth development, they are Beyond Ready.

The Beyond Ready Framework outlines six elements that provide a program development roadmap for ensuring that 4-H readiness programs are grounded in PYD.

1. Readiness Begins with a High-Quality PYD Program Context. As shown in the 4-H Thriving Model of Positive Youth Develop, four important elements must be present in high quality 4-H PYD programs, Sparks, Belonging, Developmental Relationships with adults, and Youth Engagement. These elements make up a high quality PYD 4-H experience for youth.

2. Work Readiness Skills and Documentation. Helping youth be ready for work through programs that promote demonstrable skills, such as criticalthinking, communication and problem-solving. This happens by providing high quality educational programs that increases youths' content knowledge in key areas, often related to 4-H project areas. Youth can further be supported for work readiness by documenting their readiness through records, certificates and achievements.

3. Life Readiness. Youths' social, emotional, cognitive abilities and positive habits of mind and behaviors are important qualities for lifelong success. These qualities show up in work readiness in a number of ways, for example, flexibility, creativity and adaptability. The Thriving Indicators of the 4-H Thriving Model describe seven ways that 4-H builds life readiness.

4. Creating and Navigating Post-Secondary Pathways. The transition to what happens after high school is more varied and complicated for youth than ever before, with multiple possibilities, complex social influences, and ever-present uncertainties about the future. 4-H needs to be intentional about providing programs that help youth identify and create a post-secondary plan, and assist with helping them navigate it successfully.

5.Beyond Ready. Youth who participate in high quality 4-H PYD Programs that promote work readiness and help young people identify, create and navigate post-secondary plans are Beyond Ready for work and life because of the work readiness skills they developed in 4-H and the way that their positive development shows up in their social and emotional skills, behaviors, and positive habits of mind and being. Beyond Ready Youth are Healthy, Productive and Engaged.

Creating and consuming food requires a wide variety of inputs, while also producing outputs, including some that are wasteful and harmful to the earth.

You'll come to see that modern food systems can be wasteful and that making informed food choices can eventually contribute to impactful changes.
