## A Busy Time of Year for Nevada State 4-H

Late summer is a busy time for us all. Some are squeezing in the last few outings while the weather is nice. School is starting back up, which means getting school supplies and coordinating new schedules. Some 4-H members are concluding their projects, and getting ready for Expo. Record books and portfolios are being finalized for year's end.

The next two months are also a busy time for the Nevada State 4-H Office. Several tasks must be completed by the end of the 4-H year. September 30. The most time-sensitive task is getting all of the financial reports from each 4-H Club and Leader group to their county office. All club reports are due to county offices by August 1, 2025. If the club has a bank account, they must also include copies of each monthly statement for the July 1, 2024 to June 30, 2025 fiscal year.

Each county will create a report from the club forms and submit those to the State 4-H Office. The state office will then forward the report to the University Financial Officer to use as part of Tax reporting. Club leaders should be aware that not reporting could lead to your club charter being made inactive. That would eliminate your tax-exempt status until the situation is resolved.

Please note: If you are late with your report and need forms to complete it, you can find them in the NevadaBox "Financial Reports" folder <a href="https://nevada.box.com/s/6kcch87nmaci0f5yrcp2ctqqv81830p7">https://nevada.box.com/s/6kcch87nmaci0f5yrcp2ctqqv81830p7</a>).

As of this year, all clubs and affiliates in the state must be under the same EIN number. Everyone should be using the number for Nevada Extension 4-H Youth Development, Inc. If a club is using an older number, it must be changed at their bank if applicable) Otherwise they do not have tax-exempt status and may not accept charitable gifts. If you need that number, contact your county office.

Another project for the state office is the Nevada State 4-H Expo on September 25-28 at the 3C Arena Complex in Fallon. Accepting entries from across the state, making sure all the qualifications are met, and fees are paid is one part of that. The deadline for

a member who has qualified for Expo to submit their entry and fees is Friday, August 29, 2025 at 5 p.m.

At this year's 4-H Expo Awards Ceremony on Saturday, September 27 in Fallon, volunteers and teens from across the state will be recognized for their contributions to 4-H. There are three awards open:

- 4-H Volunteer of the Year Award (recognizes a volunteer for their outstanding service at the local, county, or state level)
- 4-H Youth-Adult Partnership Award (recognizes volunteers who develop partnerships with youth that promote individual growth and foster positive community change)
- 4-H Teen Leader of the Year Award (recognizes a teen leader whose volunteer efforts in their community have made a meaningful and lasting difference at the club, county, or state level)

Nominations are open until September 13. Selfnominations are accepted, and attendance at the Expo is not required. If you would like to nominate yourself or another volunteer, please take a few minutes to fill out the nomination forms below:

## Silver State Youth Livestock Show

The Silver State Youth Livestock Show and Expo is August 14-17, 2025. It is an event of the Lyon County Fair & Rodeo. As part of the events, families will enjoy a Livestock Show, Auction, and youth exhibits.

Market and breeding shows are open to all individuals between the ages of 9 and 18 from Nevada and surrounding states. Unless specified in rules.

Youth ages 5 - 8 may show in Breeding shows and Showmanship with parent/guardian supervision. Peewees must Pre-enter. No day of show entries will be accepted

All exhibitors must be currently enrolled in a 4-H, FFA, or Grange program, or meet SSYLS requirements for Independent exhibitors. Exhibitors must own and be in possession of their lamb, goat or swine for 60 days or beef for 120 days prior to the opening date of the fair. Rabbits and poultry must be owned and in possession of their animals 30 days prior to fair.

Dry Camping areas are available to exhibitors. It must be payed for through the online entry system with your entries. Please Note: no hookups for water or sewer are available.

The deadline for entering is August 1, 2025. All Classes <u>must</u> be entered online. No written/mailed entries will be accepted.
