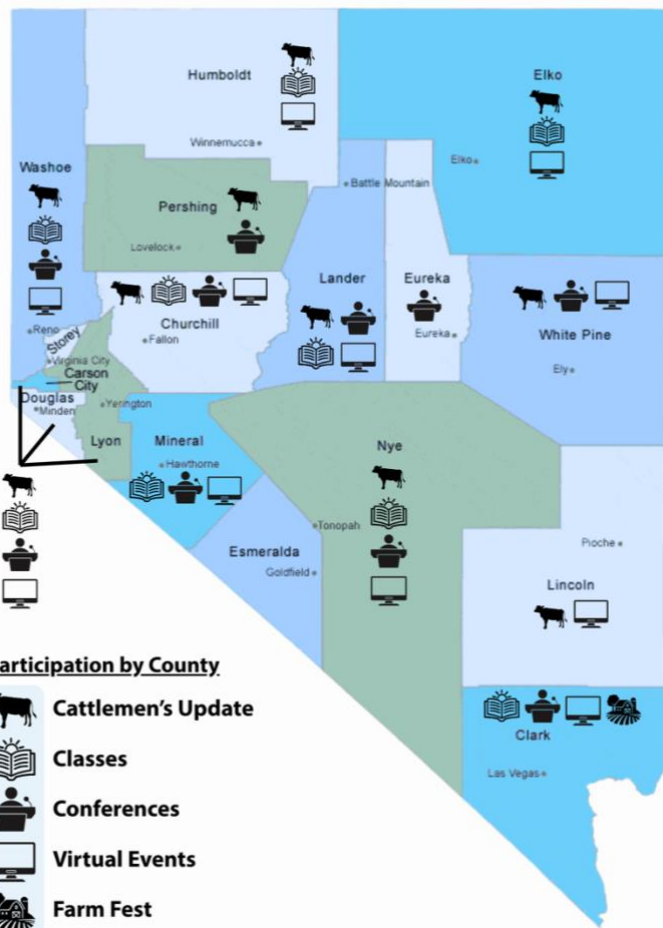


Nevada Agriculture Risk Management Program Impact 2025

This project was supported by USDA, Risk Management Agency grant award # RMA24CPT0013923.

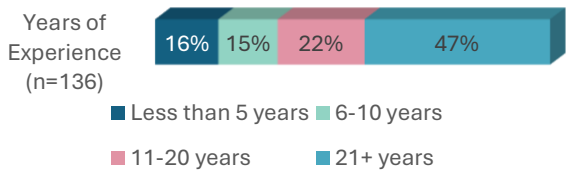


The Nevada Agriculture Risk Management team uses the latest research to deliver practical knowledge, business management tools and actionable resources that help producers navigate risk and adapt to an increasingly complex food and agricultural system. In 2025, the team implemented 17 high-impact workshops, outreach events and trainings, reaching 976 producers, 283 teachers and chaperones, and 1,663 students. This includes:

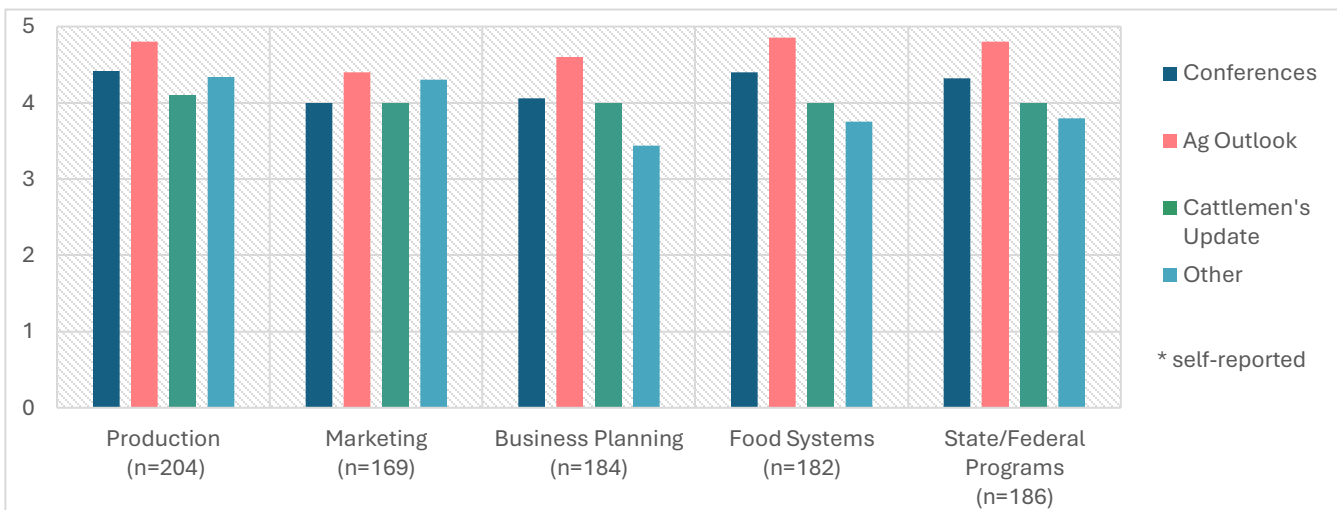

Participant experience

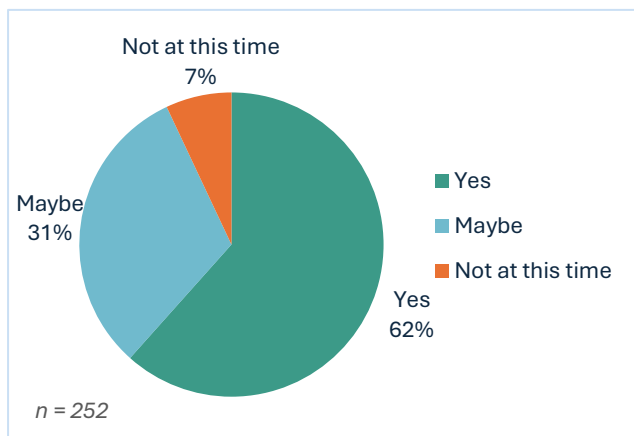


Increases in knowledge:

A mean score of **4.2*** suggests that participants' knowledge in multiple pillars of risk management improved significantly through the risk management education programs.
