

Nevada Tribal Programs 2025 Impacts

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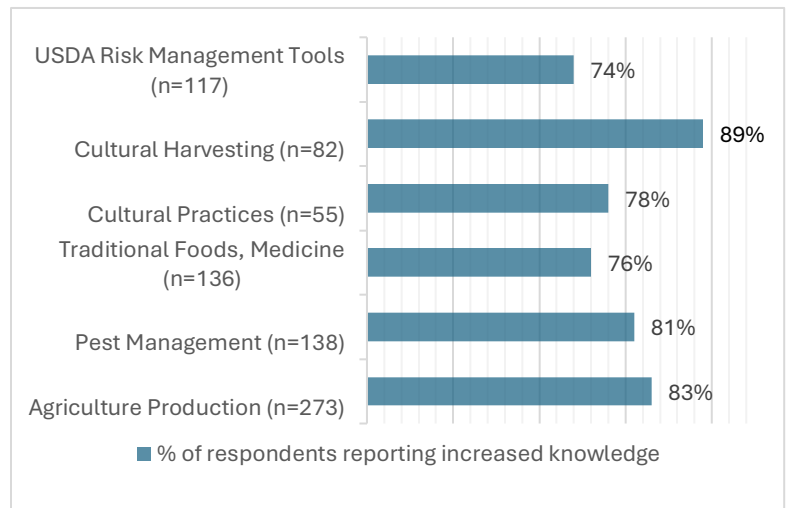
Nevada Tribal Extension Programs delivered 69 hands-on workshops, educational activities and partnership meetings that engaged 4,160 participants statewide. Programming is designed to advance food sovereignty, strengthen Tribal economies, improve food security among vulnerable populations, and empower Tribal youth with personal and career pathways, all while honoring and preserving cultural traditions. This includes:

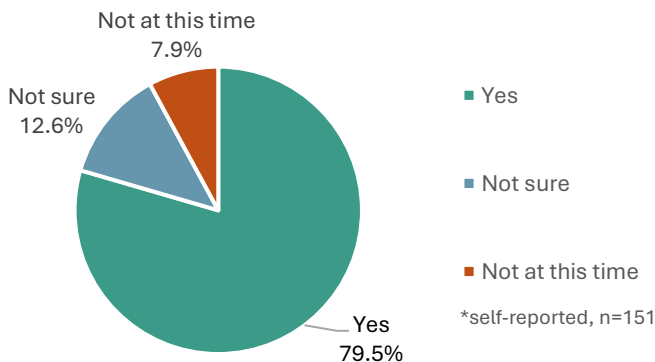

* self-reported, Growers Workshops, Cultural Harvests

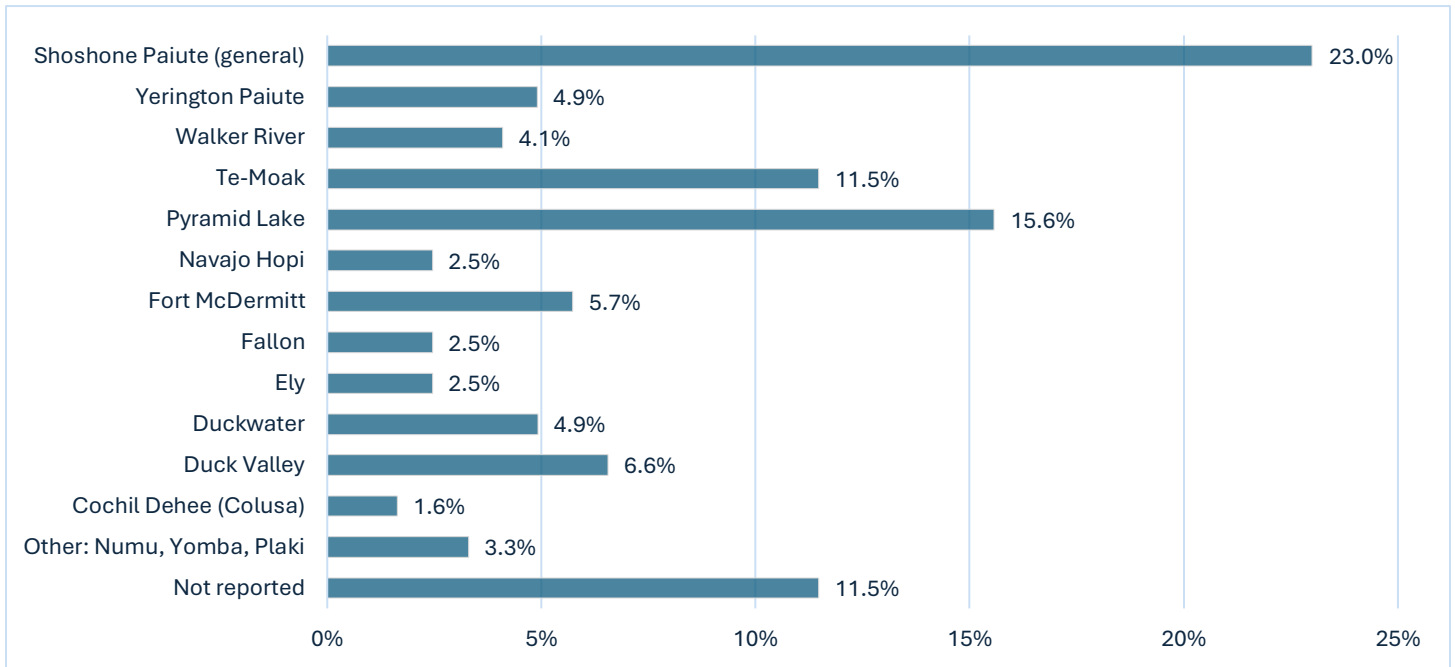
Participants planning to take action*:
